  - Cells: **All cells with Hotspots**

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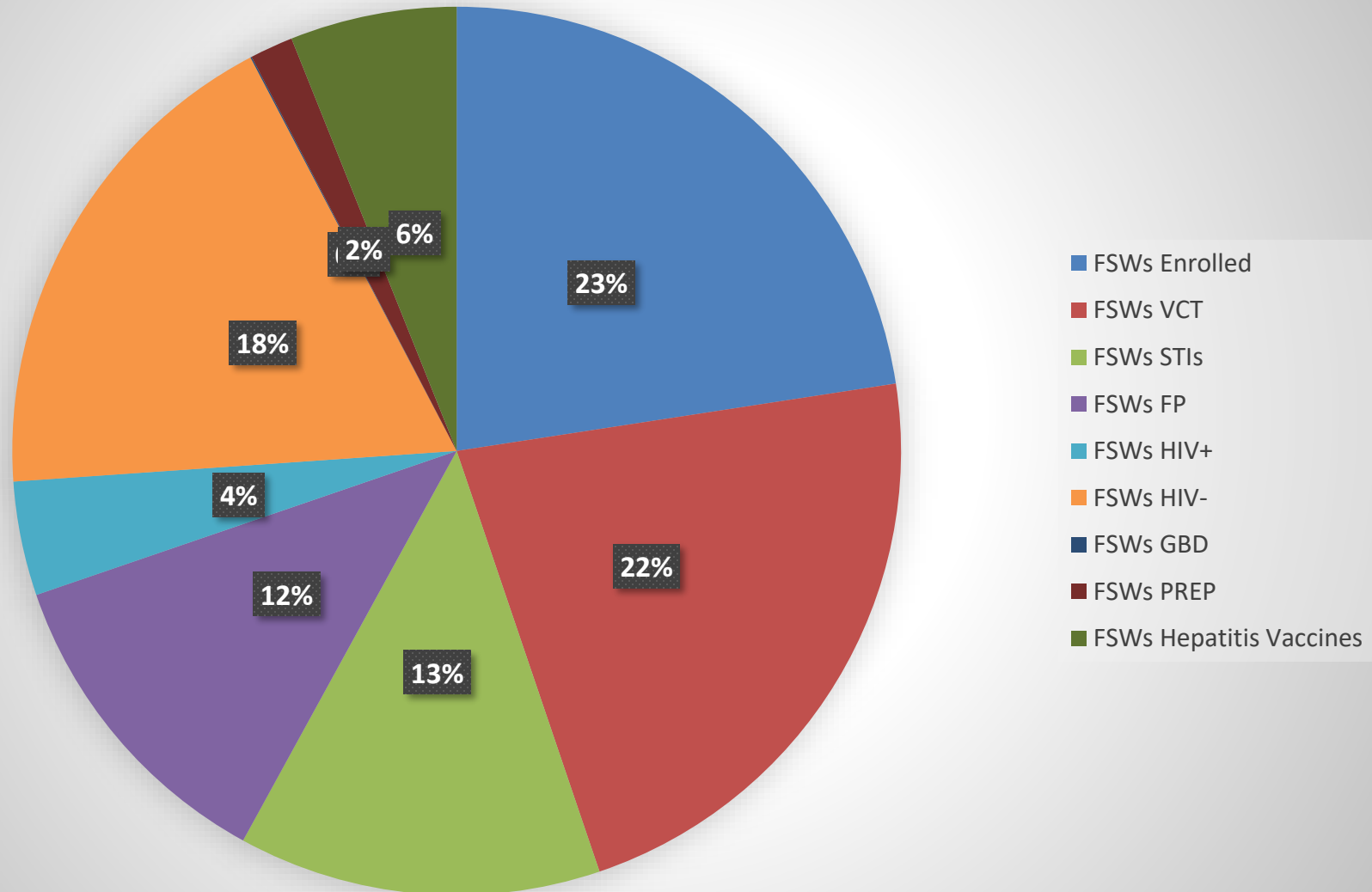

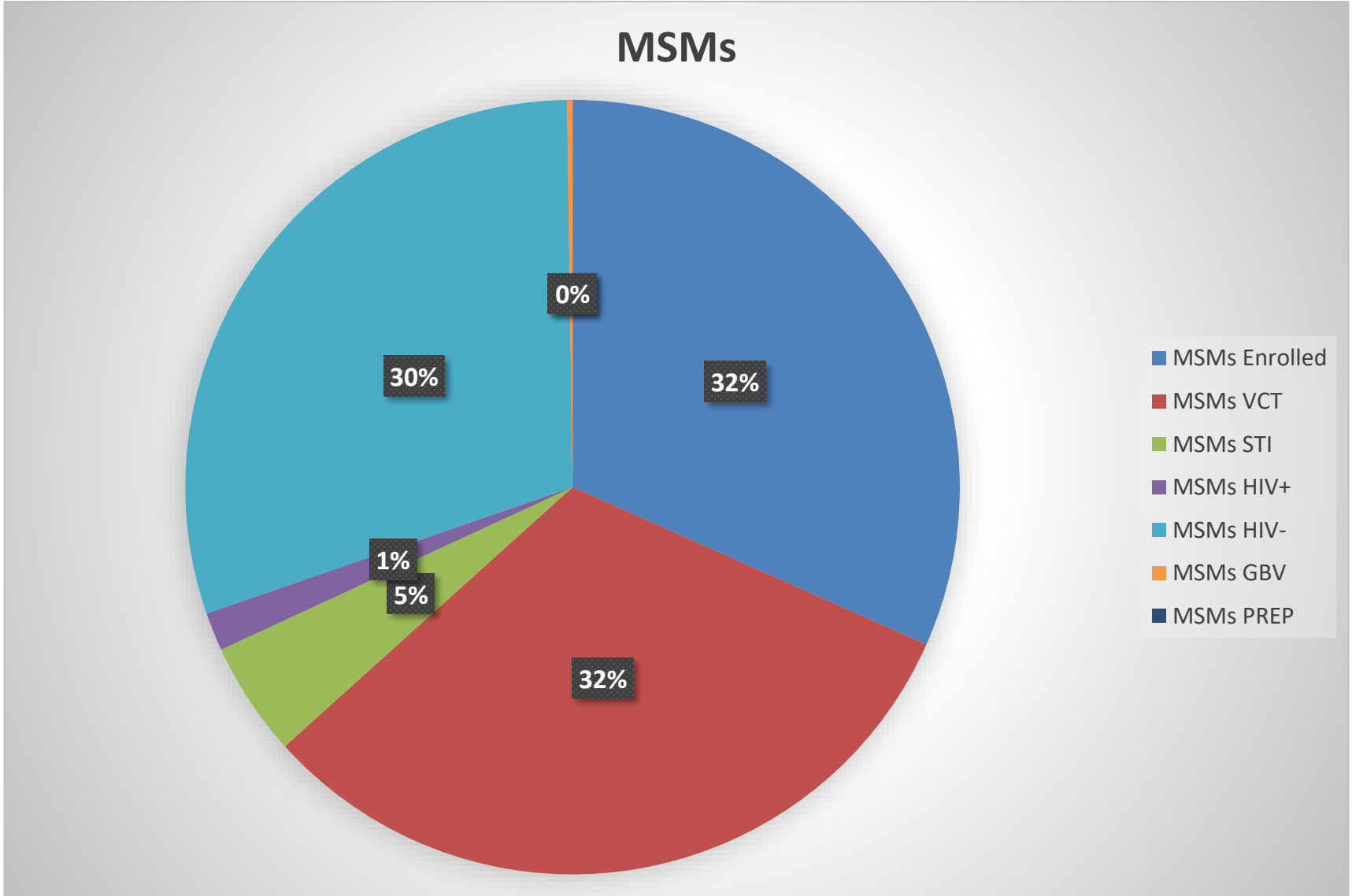

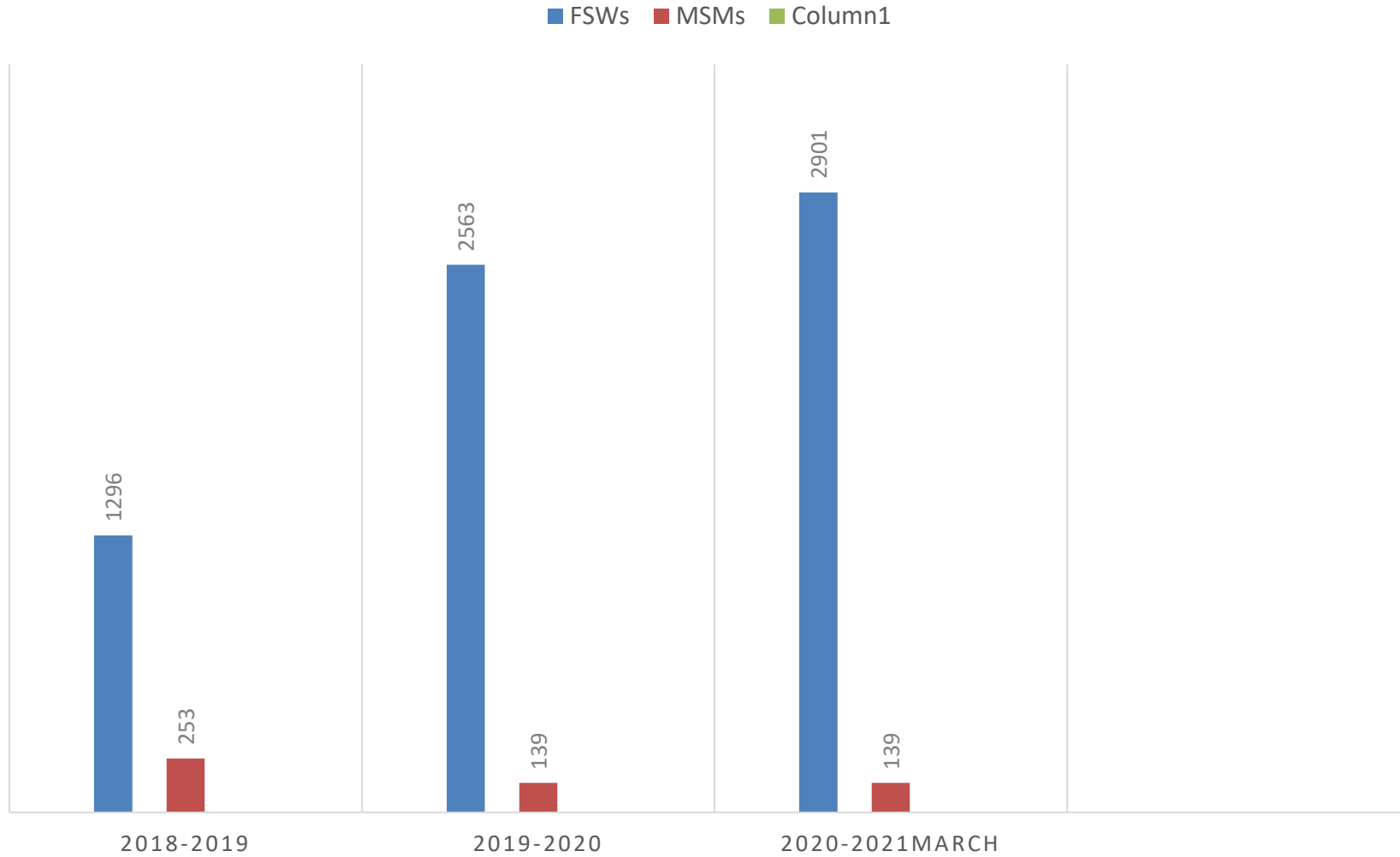


# Key Data to share( Graphs trends 2 previous years ) MSMs

# Challenges

- \* Scarcity of STIs medicines at Health Centers and District Pharmacies.
- \* Many FSWs not cooperating in providing necessary information for Index testing;
- \* Insufficient information provided by KP is a challenge (Fake Information in Key Population Medical File {KPMF} ex: Number of Protected sex with Condom,).
- \* Many Health Centers are Faith based (Religious) which make them not providing Family Planning methods and Condoms for HIV prevention.
- \* Lack of external fund to support the Key population projects that increase their strength economically.
- \* There is no online Database that registers PLHIV on ARV, which bring the problem of people that take ARV Medicines twice at two different health centers.
- \* The District of **Muhanga, Ruhango and Nyamasheke** don't have **Condom KIOSKE** that distributes Condoms for free 24/7.
- \* Lack of activities that targeting vulnerable children born to FSWs.
- \* Lack of intervention targeting People who inject Drugs
- \* Taboos: people not open to talk about, sexuality, sexual orientation which increase the number of unwanted pregnancy that lead to unsafe abortion in mostly teenagers



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- \* High level of stigma and discrimination to Key population.
- \* Stigma and discrimination to Key population in community.
- \* Local authorities have limited understanding the LGBTI community as people who have rights like other people.
- \* Lack of Economy strengthening and income generating activities among Key Population.



# Recommendations

If possible this project can also focus on care and treatment of Female Sex Workers children (Children's born to FSWs)	Ministry of Health / RBC/IMRO
Availability of STIs medicines	Ministry of Health / RBC/IMRO
Identification of the new Hotspots in order to reach isolated key population.	Ministry of Health / RBC/IMRO
Moonlights at hotspots & Index testing are needed to reach more key population and identifying new cases among FSWs and their clients.	Key Population /HCs / Nurses / IMRO
